- (2) To compile a <u>Roadmap with Milestones</u> for **industry improvements** in <u>strategic, high impact and far-reaching domains</u>
- (3) To launch (a) <u>system improvement</u> initiatives and(b) <u>demonstration projects</u>, in *prioritized focus areas*.

Shortfalls in standards for better project formulation and designs

Lack of client involvement and/or 'competent 'management

Lack of trust between stakeholders

Acute shortage of skilled workmen

Lack of proper facilities for workers

Low productivity

Lack of productivity benchmarks and standards

Lack of innovation

[1c] Ci3 India Regional Roundtable of Building Construction Clients (CONTINUED)

Post-Focus Group Consolidation session – identified 16 critical issues:

- <u>ISSUES 9-16:</u>

Barriers to off-site (pre-cast/ pre-fab)construction

Inadequate quality

Inadequate governance by owners and transparency

Sub-standard and one-sided contracts

Need for better contractor selection system

Improper supply chain management and need to shift to alternate contracting approaches

Lack of technology adoption

Reluctance to adopt new work practices such as Lean practices

Overview of the issues identified at 1st Regional Roundtable

One combined Focus group session - outcomes from the first Regional Roundtable were endorsed, in general. Degree of emphasis varied on their criticality

<u>In addition, a few other critical issues were identified:</u>

Inefficient design process management

Uneconomical design codes and operational standards

Outdated operational design codes

Moving forward after the Chennai and Mumbai Roundtable <u>s</u>

- 19 current and imminent <u>critical issues</u> were identified. Note - Some identified issues are comparable to findings of previous reported studies too eg. Sawhney et al. (2014)
- To address the above identified 19 critical issues were rationalized, consolidated & 'translated' into Action Items
- Action Teams were assembled to work on each Action Item
- The Action Teams include academics, industry participants fr om the Chennai and Mumbai Roundtables and other invited e xperts

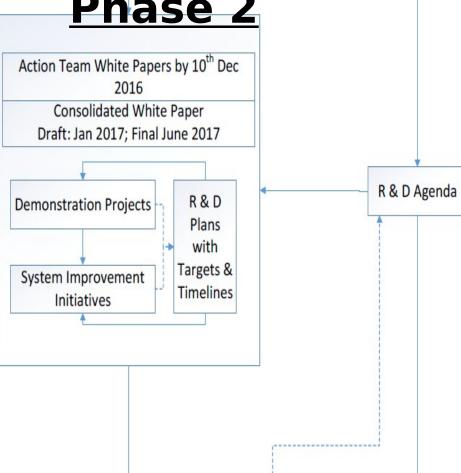

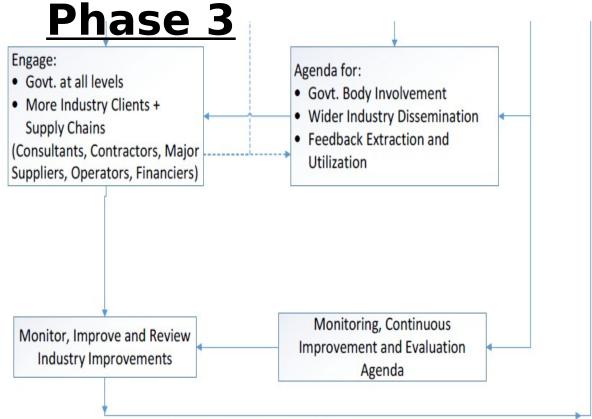
